 Step outside your back door – what can you see, smell or hear? Plants can smell to attract insects, birds are noisier at different times of the day, and everything looks much greener after it has rained.





• Is there a pot plant in your yard? Ask an adult to move it for you and see what is living underneath. What can you see?



• Do you have a tree or bush that has flowers at the moment? What colours can you see? What colours are the blossom?



 Do you have a bird table or bird feeder in your garden? Do you feed the birds with crumbs or seeds? I have kookaburras who love to eat the rodents in my yard and magpies who like me to feed them when I feed the chooks. We have different parrots and cockatoos that fly around, especially when there is fruit on the trees. I would much rather they did not eat the fruit!





• Do you have any pets in your yard? Or do your neighbours? What do you call your pets? Who named them? What is special about your pets?



• Do you grow vegetables or fruit or in your yard? You might not need a tractor to sow your seeds or harvest your crop, but it still takes work to dig and plant and weed and care for your food. Who in your family looks after your garden?



 Do you have chickens to produce eggs? Chickens need good food, clean water, comfy home, daylight, and somewhere cosy to lay their eggs. When they are happy, they feed you so you need to look after them first.





 Do you have a worm farm for your kitchen scraps, or perhaps an area of soil you can carefully dig over and find some worms? Worms are essential for healthy soil – only healthy soil can grow our food and plants. Everything has its place.
