# **ASH WEDNESDAY**

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent. There are 40 days of preparation leading up to Easter. We celebrate Ash Wednesday with a service where we make the sign of the cross in ash on the back of our hands or on our foreheads. The ash comes from the burnt palm leaves of the previous year's Easter. Sadly, this year's Ash Wednesday service was cancelled as the week-long lockdown began. ## **ACTIVITIES**

### · Ashes and sign of cross

Get some dust from the garden and imagine it is ash from the palm leaves. Dip your finger into the ash and make the sign of the cross on the back of your hand. This is your symbol for the beginning of Lent.





## PALM SUNDAY

This is the day that Jesus entered Jerusalem. The people were happy to see him that day. But one week later, it was a very different story.

Mark 11:1-11

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, "Why are you doing this?" just say this, "The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately." They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, 'What are you doing, untying the colt?' They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting,

'Hosanna!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!

Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David!

Hosanna in the highest heaven!'

Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.

### **ACTIVITIES**

### • Cheer Up!!

Find an old newspaper, scrap paper or any offcuts you may have-left over Christmas wrap works well. Cut these into very thin strips and tape the ends to make some pom-poms. See photo below. Pretend you are in the crowd cheering for Jesus. You can use the bible verse above or make up your own cool chant.


Donkey Craft

To make your Donkey Mask you will need-**Scissors** Cardboard with 1 blank side Pencil & black marker Hole punch String or wool Pencils, Markers or paint to decorate



Copy the template below starting with the Nose/Mouth piece. Draw the Head & cut both of these out. Draw and cut out the ears/eyes Draw and cut out the teeth

Nose/Mouth Piece



Eyes & Ears






Head









### To assemble-

Start by gluing the head behind the Nose/Mouth piece.
Using the hole punch, punch out 2 eye holes then glue the eyes to the top of the head.

Glue the ears & eyes overlapping the top of the Head.

Draw on the mouth then glue on your teeth,

Glue Head to Nose/Mouth



Glue Eyes on top of Head.




Draw Muth & glue on Teeth.



Punch 2 holes on the outside of each cheek and tie on a piece of string or wool to each hole.

Decorate with whatever you like!

Punch holes at sides of Cheeks..



Attach string or wool



Decorate as you wish

## • Leaf rubbings

You'll need some leaves, different shapes and sizes like these, some paper and some crayons or colouring

pencils.





Place the leaves under the paper and gently rub the crayon or pencil over the top so the shapes of the leaves come through. Some leaves have more distinctive veins that show through whereas other leaves are much smoother.





# **MAUNDY THURSDAY**

On the Thursday night, Jesus shared a last meal with his disciples, his special friends. Jesus took bread and wine and blessed it, broke it and gave it to everyone there. We call this the last supper and we remember when we have communion in church.

When the meal was over, Jesus took them into the Garden of Gethsemane to pray. The disciples fell asleep and Jesus was arrested.

#### Mark 14: 17-25

When it was evening, he came with the twelve. And when they had taken their places and were eating, Jesus said, 'Truly I tell you, one of you will betray me, one who is eating with me.' They began to be distressed and to say to him one after another, 'Surely, not I?' He said to them, 'It is one of the twelve, one who is dipping bread\* into the bowl\* with me. For the Son of Man goes as it is written of him, but woe to that one by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been better for that one not to have been born.'

While they were eating, he took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it he broke it, gave it to them, and said, 'Take; this is my body.' Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks he gave it to them, and all of them drank from it. He said to them, 'This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many. Truly I tell you, I will never again drink of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God.'

#### · Feet washing and home Pedi



# **GOOD FRIDAY**

This is the day that Jesus died. The Roman soldiers put him on a cross and he died between 2 robbers. One of the robbers reached out to Jesus and asked him for forgiveness of the things he had done in his life. When Jesus died, one of the soldiers at the foot of the cross realised that he was the Son of God.

A man called Joseph took Jesus' body and put it in an empty tomb. Because it was Passover time, the women couldn't wrap him properly as was their custom.

This is why we have crosses on our hot cross buns.

#### Mark 15:33-39

When it was noon, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. At three o'clock Jesus cried out with a loud voice, 'Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?' which means, 'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?'\* When some of the bystanders heard it, they said, 'Listen, he is calling for Elijah.' And someone ran, filled a sponge with sour wine, put it on a stick, and gave it to him to drink, saying, 'Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to take him down.' Then Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. Now when the centurion, who stood facing him, saw that in this way he - breathed his last, he said, 'Truly this man was God's Son!'

# **Prayer Cross**

Gather together some sticks from the garden, string or twine, paper or card stock, white ribbon (optional) a hole punch & black marker.

Cut the sticks to the measurements below-Large Cross-25cm Vertically 11cm Horizontally

> Small Cross-16cm Vertically 8cm Horizontally

Lash the sticks together with the twine to make a cross shape. Cut out a tag from your paper or card stock and punch a hole at one end.

Write your prayers or who you would like to pray for and tie your tag with twine or ribbon to the center of your cross!





## **EASTER SUNDAY**

After 3 days, and after the Jewish festival of Passover had finished, the women who were part of Jesus' friendship group went to the tomb to wrap Jesus' body as was the Jewish tradition.

When they got there, they didn't find Jesus at all. He had risen.


#### Mark 16:1-8

When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, 'Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?' When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, 'Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you.' So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

The story is that women took hard boiled eggs in a basket to the tomb. When they reached the tomb and saw Jesus wasn't there, the eggs changed into bright colours. This is why we have colourful chocolate eggs on Easter Sunday.

Paper Strip Angel Craft
Materials for Paper Angel
Scissors
Glue stick
Pencil
Ruler
Wool or string



White paper or card cut into strips:
For the wings: Two strips of paper 2cm x 15cm
For the head: One strip 2cm x 10cm
For the top of the body: One strip 2cmx 18cm
For the bottom of the body: One strip 2cm x 9cm



Directions:

1. Place glue onto one edge of your 10cm long strip and glue
it into a circle to make the Head. Set it aside.







2. Make an angel wing by placing some glue on one edge of a 15cm stripand gluing the other end down on top of it to form a teardrop shape as shown below. Do this for the second wing. Set them aside.



3. To make the angel's body place glue onto both ends of the 18cm strip and glue them down onto each end of the 9cm inch strip, forming a bell shape as shown below.



4. Glue Head to body

5. Glue each wing to the side of the angel.
You can have the wing face out,
down, or up!



Tips and Ideas

When gluing your paper together, you might need to press and hold the paper securely for a few seconds to let it dry and stick together. Children can also embellish their angels with textas, sequins, or other craft items.



# WALKING AND TALKING ON THE ROAD

After he had died and risen again, Jesus appeared to his disciples many times. He wanted to remind them of all that he had taught them. One time was when he walked along with 2 disciples going to Emmaus. They talked to Jesus without realising who he was – they only realised when he broke the bread and they remembered the last supper.

#### Luke 24:28-35

As they came near the village to which they were going, he walked ahead as if he were going on. But they urged him strongly, saying, 'Stay with us, because it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over.' So he went in to stay with them. When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight. They said to each other, 'Were not our hearts burning within us\* while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?' That same hour they got up and returned to Jerusalem; and they found the eleven and their companions gathered together. They were saying, 'The Lord has risen indeed, and he has appeared to Simon!' Then they told what had happened on the road, and how he had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread.

### STORY OF EASTER

Remind yourselves about the whole story of Easter week from Palm Sunday through to Easter Sunday.

Having read all of the readings with the activities, think back to one scene you want to recreate and then use the lego, the playdough or the pencils to produce your own artwork to represent it.

Place all the artwork on the table as you now take turns to re-read the readings and use what you have produced to explain what you think might be happening in those scenes.

### **REFLECT**

It's important to remember that, although parts of the Easter story are very sad, the sad bits are not the end, they are just part of the story. The story of Easter is actually about hope and love and grace and new life.

Everyone experiences sad parts in life. You may have already experienced the death of a pet or someone you love. This is sad. But the sad bits are not the whole of your life. It is very important to remember and celebrate the joy.

### **PRAYER**

Share your crosses and prayers now with each other – one of you can say this prayer at the end:

God of love,

You know what is in our hearts and minds even before we do.

Take all our prayers and hold them in your gentle hands, and remember those whom we forget.

Amen
